However, a significant portion of these costs relate to cleaning services, specialist clothing and footwear, forgone property rents and lease income, waiving of footpath permits and childcare levies, which would normally sit under other service categories.

 - COVID-19 testing site opened at MSAC at Albert Park on 29 June.
