## STREETSCAPE UPGRADE

### Feedback form

As part of Council's ongoing streetscape improvement program, a streetscape renewal project for Greeves Street, St Kilda, is scheduled for construction by the end of 2012. A new concept design for the streetscape has now been developed and Council is keen to hear the community's feedback. Please tell us how satisfied you are that the concept design addresses the following issues.

#### Lighting and safety

What has been done so far?

- Extended arms were added to all street lights in 2010, positioning them over the middle of the road to provide more even lighting to both sides of the street.

What are we proposing?

- Removal of trees in front of No. 3 and No. 5 to allow more light to reach the footpaths and reduce light obstruction caused by dense interlocking tree canopies
- Pruning of some tree canopies to improve lighting and reduce the number of 'dark spots' along the street
- Incorporating lighting into existing garden beds and within feature trees
- Incorporating wayfinding features at 8-15 m intervals along the footpath to help guide and direct people safely along the street.

#### Drainage

What has been done so far?

- A regular maintenance program for existing drains is currently in place
- Council is working on a municipal flood mitigation process that will include drainage strategies for Greeves Street. Technical consultants have undertaken flood modelling in consultation with Melbourne Water to provide Council with recommendations to reduce flooding in Greeves Street.

What are we proposing?

- Appropriate drainage solutions based on recommendations from the flood modelling study that may result in the redesign and construction of traffic islands, inclusion of new pits and pipes, and realignment of the bluestone kerb and channel in certain sections of Greeves Street.

## Landscaping

What are we proposing?

- Appropriate landscaping materials for garden beds to avoid runoff onto the road pavement
- Selecting plants that are drought-tolerant, require minimum maintenance and whose foliage will not clog litter traps
- Establishing a vigilant maintenance plan over twelve months with successful contractor to ensure plants are well established and any damaged plants are quickly replaced (once contract period has ceased Council will take over routine maintenance of the streetscape).
