In many locations across our City, there are now significantly more Parking Permits issued than there are available car spaces.

WHAT WE ASKED

Question 1

Do you agree that there should be a maximum of two Resident Parking Permits per household?

WHAT YOU TOLD US

57% of residents

agreed there should be maximum of two permits per household.

Question 2

Should households with access to off-street parking be eligible for fewer Resident Parking Permits?

47% of residents

agreed that households with offstreet parking should be allowed fewer permits.

WHAT WE PROPOSE

- 1 Reduce total number of Resident Parking Permits available to each eligible residential property without off-street parking from three to two.
- 2 Further reduce maximum number of Resident Parking Permits available to each residential property with off-street parking accessed via a driveway, based on the number of off-street car spaces available.



- Manage and respond to supply and demand in residential areas.
- 2 Promote use of existing parking resources to reduce pressure on local parking availability.
- 3 Encourage reduced car ownership and car dependence and greater use of alternative, sustainable modes of transport.
